Guidance

This guidance is aimed at Commercial, Technical and Construction teams whom all play a role in ensuring we fulfil our waste duty of care requirements.

Below are typical waste streams which we are likely to produce on our construction sites. This guidance is intended to support teams when completing / updating the **Waste Duty of Care Schedule** in the **Project Environmental Plan** (section 7.4).

Entries must be made in the schedule for each type of waste being removed from site. Entries must include the associated 6-digit EWC code and a written description of the waste.

See right and overleaf for a list of common waste types and their relevant EWC codes, for which we are most likely to produce.
