HS&E ADVICE NOTE

NEW HS&E STANDARDS

REF: HSE/23/06

DESCRIPTION

The Group Shared Drive and Persimmon Cloud have now been updated to include new HS&E Standards (click link to read):

<u>Welfare</u>

In summary, these standards set out:

- The requirement for each site to have a welfare assessment.
- The responsibilities for welfare facilities.
- The welfare facilities required; toilets/ washing facilities, changing/ drying rooms, lockers, rest/ eating areas and drinking water.
- The ratio of toilets to the number of people at work, ensuring;
 - > Arrangements in place for mixed use or female only toilets.
 - Toilets are readily accessible, as a guide construction workers and site visitors should not have to walk more than 150 metres to reach toilet facilities.
 - Washing facilities are next to all toilets and should include clean hot/ warm and cold, running water with a means of cleaning and drying hands, face and forearms. This includes satellite facilities and options would include a portaloo with a generator or connected to the electricity of a plot or a solar loo. A stock plot can be used to provide facilities for a small number of workers for a short duration of time. Arrangements must be then made to clean/ replace the sanitary ware after use.
- Specific arrangements for; site set up/ closure, electrical safety, fire safety and cleaning.

The Group Commercial Department will shortly be issuing further guidance on the products that can be used for satellite facilities.

Lifting Operations

In summary, these standards set out:

- The categories of lifts; basic, intermediate and complex.
- That all lifts must be properly planned by a competent person, appropriately supervised and carried out in a safe manner.
- Specific arrangements for crane/ HIAB lifting operations:
 - Contact lifts and hire/ manage lifts.
 - > Personnel required.
 - Planning the lift.
 - Lift plan and risk assessment.

- > The operation; lift supervisor, slinger/ signallers/ crane/ HIAB operator.
- > Thorough examination.
- Site management requirements.
- Positioning the crane/ HIAB.
- Tall equipment permit.
- > Requirements alongside railways controlled by Network Rail.

Young Persons

In summary, these standards set out:

- The definition of a young person as someone who is under the age of 18.
- The requirement that each young person must have an individual risk assessment carried out by the site manager, apprentice master or the sub-contractor responsible for the young person.
- A young person must be partnered with and mentor and that mentor will be responsible for the day to day supervision of the young person.
- Specific arrangements for; use tools and equipment, working at height and PPE/RPE.
- Specific arrangements for school/ college site visits.
- Requirement for any young person or apprentice working on a construction site to have a Trainee or Apprentice CSCS card within 1 month of starting work on site.
