HS&E ADVICE NOTE

NEW SITE INSPECTION REGIME AND HS&E STANDARDS

REF: HSE/23/08

DESCRIPTION

Site inspection regime

From the 3rd July the following changes are being made to the HS&E site inspection regime:

- There will no longer be a separate administrative score on any of the reports, administrative compliance on site will be checked alongside operational compliance to give one combined score.
- Scored reports will now have colour codes to highlight the scores:
 - 4 score green
 - 3 score amber
 - 1 and 0 score red

This will make it easier for those reviewing the reports to pick out the areas where non-compliance has been noted.

- Each site will now receive a scored environmental inspection quarterly. Until 2024 these scores will be used to target businesses and areas where support is needed and will not be included in Group HS&E performance monitoring statistics.

New standards

The Group Shared Drive and Persimmon Cloud have now been updated to include new HS&E Standards (click link to read):

Site Start-Up

In summary, these standards set out:

- The copies of documentation that are required to be on site before commencement.
- The site welfare facilities that must be in place.
- The arrangements required for:
 - Car parking
 - First aid

- Traffic management
- Site perimeter signage
- Notice boards
- PPE and RPE
- A copy of the project environmental plan must also be available on site with adequate arrangements in place for the control of all relevant environmental risks.
- Within 48 hours if the operating taking on the appointment of Principal Contractor, the local Group HS&E Advisor will carry out a scored HS&E Client visit, to ensure all the requirements for site set up are in place.

Site Closedown

In summary, these standards set out:

- The requirement for a closedown meeting and action plan to be completed, three months prior to the expected completion date of the site.
- The specific considerations for footpaths and roads.
- Final inspection requirements including completion of a closed site risk assessment.
- Guidance on the frequency of inspection, following site closedown until handover to the management company or local authority:
 - > Playparks in use should be inspected every week, accompanied by a specific risk assessment.
 - Unfinished roads/ footpaths and other hazards such as compound and waste material in situ should be inspected every 2 weeks.
 - Site completely finished with no obvious hazards should be inspected every 6 months.
- Requirement for senior management to sign-off the close down action plan and ensure the control measures identified in the risk assessment are being completed.
